Reece aims for Brands boost

The Wendy Wools British special saloon car championship starts again this weekend and Caerphilly plant hire manager Barry Reece travels to Brands Hatch for the 14th round as he bids to regain the title he won in 1980.

With only 18 of the 21 rounds counting for the title Reece is in a strong position with an eight-point lead over Pontypridd's Buster Wallace and a nine-point lead over Londoner Michael Law.

Meanwhile, at Mallory Park, Pontypridd's Viv Wallace took a superb third place overall in the Wendy Wools British Special Saloon Car championship.

Wallace, driving the 1-litre Aalco Banannas car, also won his class and set the fastest lap. Barry Reece, driving the 850cc Isis Talbot, was fourth overall and although he won his class and set an 850cc lap record, he was never really able to challenge Wallace.

Lampeter's Tim Davies finished fifth in Pace British Formula Ford 2000 championship. Davies has spent the past seven days at the Royale factory trying to sort out the problems with the new RP32M, but the car has still been reluctant to prove its potential.

Reece boosts title bid

BARRY Reece consolidated his championship lead in the Wendy Wools British special saloon series with a fine class win and second place overall, in the fourth round at Brands Hatch yesterday, but Pontypridd's Viv Wallace gave him a tough time.

The Welsh pair were third and fourth fastest in practice, but during the race both challenged for the lead.

Reece's Isis Talbot equalled the class lap record, while Wallace's Aalco Banannas car set the fastest lap of the race. However, at the che-

quered flag it was Londoner Michael Law who won, with Reece only 1.2 sec behind, beating Wallace by only 0.3 of a second.

The next round will be at Cadwell Park, near Louth, Lincs, on April 25, another tight circuit that should suit the cars of Reece and Wallace.

At Donington Park, Lampeter's Tim Davies scored his best result of the year in the fourth round of the Pace British FF 2000 series.

Davies finished an easy fourth in the improving Royale RP 32 M.

Rees can hang on to title

A SUPER win at Silverstone yesterday by Caerphilly's Barry Rees has given him an outside chance of retaining his Wendy Wool British special saloon car title in the last part of the season.

Following a lack lustre performance at Thruxton, Rees showed surprising pace to take victory by just over half a second from championship leader Ginger Marshall.

With three rounds to go, Rees now has to make up 16 points. The next round is at Snetterton on September 18.

Also at Silverstone yesterday was Tim Davies with his ninth win of the season to extend his lead in the British 2000 Championship to 66 points. The next round is at Castle Combe on September 17.
